Ladies and Gentlemen,

Distinguished members of the faculty,

Honored guests,

Proud graduates,

It is a great honor for me to be present in today's ceremonial event. Delivering the commencement speech to the young graduates is indeed a true privilege. I would like to thank the management of the school for this excellent opportunity.

As professionals you will be asked to contribute to the modern society's most important goal; that of development. And by the term, we mean development in all aspects of human life. We mean cultural and societal development and progress, and we also mean economic development and prosperity.

However, in order to achieve development, we must as a society be innovative. And innovation is synonymous to knowledge, and fresh ideas produced by young and daring minds. Your minds! Thus far, we have seen that development goes hand-in-hand with innovation and knowledge. Ideas alone are not always enough to produce development. Knowledge is essential. And knowledge is acquired largely through education. From that point of view then, you are already on the right track.

I repeat that the knowledge that you have accumulated throughout your years at Pinewood, constitute the corner-stone of what you are about to build in the future. contribution for which we are all grateful. Because knowledge is a commodity that should only be accumulated. Rather, it should be passed on. It should be transferred to the next generation so that it can be the "raw material" upon which new knowledge shall be generated.

Finally they should always arm youngsters with the values and ideals that are indicative of our society's culture.
